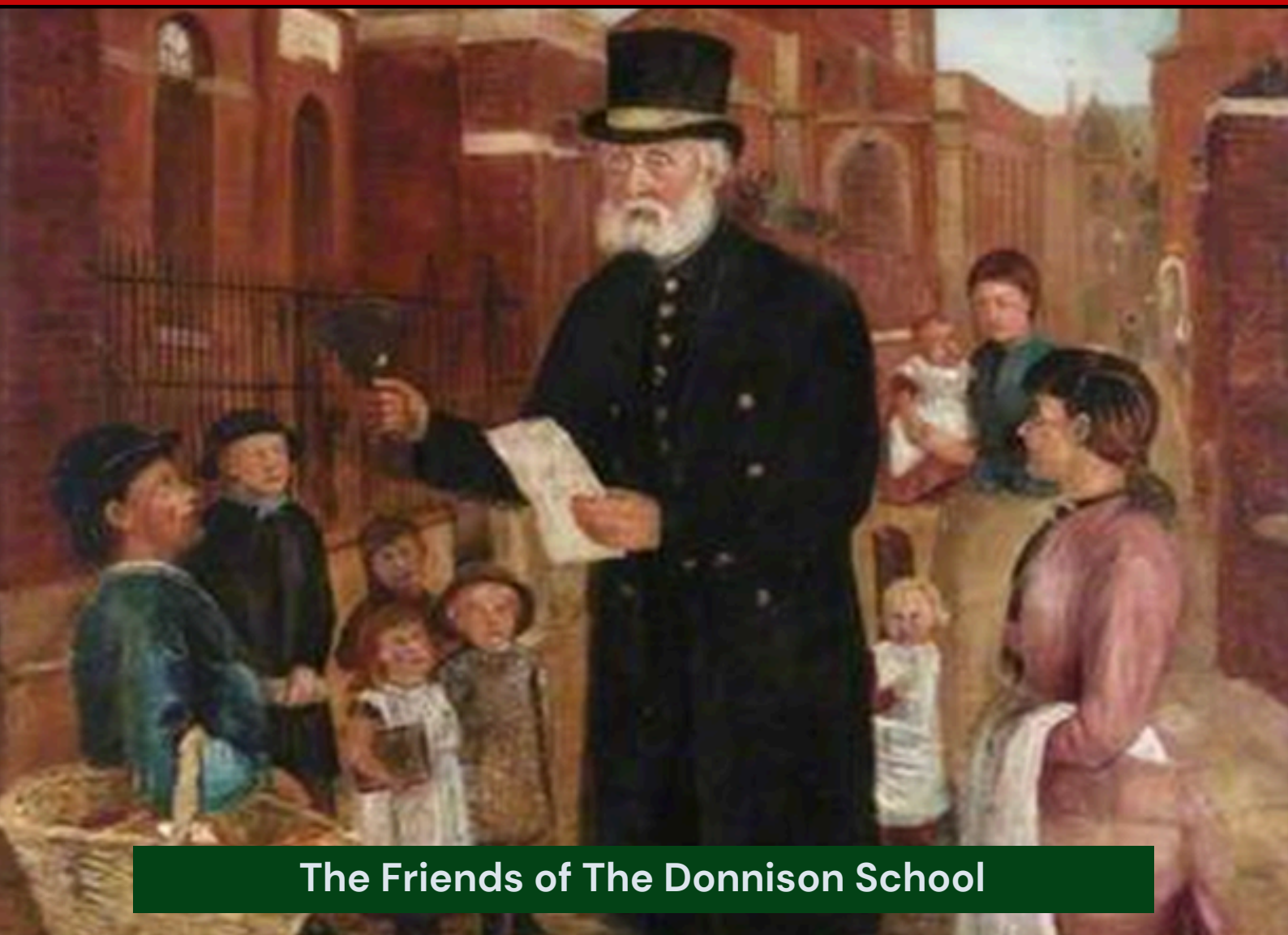

Monday 30th March

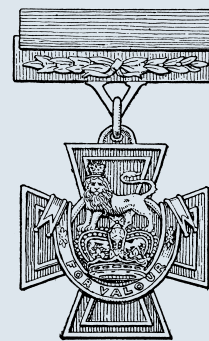
Trace the proud history of coal mining in Sunderland, from its industrial heyday to its decline, and reflect on the legacy it left behind.

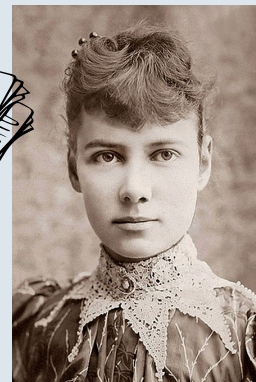
